6. Governance, Leadership and Management

6.1 State the Vision and Mission of the institution

6.3.1 Curriculum Development

02 faculty members were the members of U.G Board of Studies in English and Home Science. House tests, class tests are conducted according to University Norms, Subject allocation as per specialization of teachers. Two Career-oriented Certificate Courses (Communicative English and Computer Based Accounting) were introduced in session 2013-14.

6.3.2 Teaching and Learning

Adopting innovative teaching pedagogies is our main objective and major strength. Group discussion, field study, debates, tutorial, seminars, study tours etc. are adopted for proper understanding of subjects and thereby ensuring efficient teaching-learning process. Dean Academics ensures the preparation of workloads, time-tables for different disciplines and well defined unitization of syllabus by each staff member. Well stocked Library with INFLIBNET facility. National Seminars, Workshop, extension lectures, Conferences are also organized. Teachers are encouraged to attend Faculty Development Program such as Orientation Programs, Refresher Courses, Seminars and Workshops. Faculty Members are also encouraged to undertake research activities.

6.3.3 Examination and Evaluation

To evaluate performance of the students, 1st Term and 2nd Term House Tests are conducted in September and December according to University rule Results are sent to their parents. Internal assessment based on the marks secured by students in house tests will be sent to the Controller of Exam P.U. through software provided by the University. Different types of evaluation methods are adopted. University appoints examination officers to ensure smooth conduct of University exams. College appoints Centre Supdt., Deputy Supdt., Asstt. Supdts. and other staff for the exams. Teacher-wise results are examined by the Governing Body of the college. To evaluate the performance of teaching and learning, feedback is taken from students, alumni, parents and other stakeholders.

Special Tests and Special Classes are held.

6.3.4 Research and Development

The college encourages the teachers for research work. The college is already having 13 Ph.D teachers. Teachers are encouraged to attend Seminars/ Conferences'/Workshops and submit proposals for projects. Eminent scholars / researchers are invited to deliver extension lectures for the benefits of students. During 2013-14, 01 faculty member completed Ph.D., 01 enrolled for M.Phil. 07 faculty members presented research paper at National/International conferences and 11 research papers have got published in Journals of National and International repute.

6.3.5 Library, ICT and physical infrastructure / instrumentation

The college have well stocked library with INFLIBNET facility. During 2013-14, 892 Text-Books worth Rs. 197182/-, 06 Reference Books worth Rs. 5406/-, 75 Journals worth Rs. 49899 and 04 e-resources worth Rs. 300 were purchased. Regular updating the Labs is done. General and account offices are computerized, Teachers are encouraged to teach with Interactive Boards and Interactive LCD Projectors and OHP projectors. A sum of Rs. 77127/- was spent on the maintenance and upgradation of Computer facility and Rs. 1091645/- was spent on Infrastructures. Regular upgradation of infrastructure is done. A new hi-tech Conference hall was built and construction of Common Room for girls has been started. 26 CCTV cameras are installed at various places in the College.

6.3.6 Human Resource Management

IQAC allocates subjects to the teaching staff according to their area of specialisation and experience. College Advisory Committee, Examination Committee, Library Committee etc. along with Dean Academics, Dean Co-academics and Dean Sports plan and implement the activities of the session. Evaluation of the teachers are done through Annual Confidential Report, additional increments, Self-appraisal report and API Proformas. Along with teaching, 26 committiees/societies have been made and each department performs 2 to 3 activities during each session (Details of Committees given in Annexure-IX (i to iii).

Title of the Practice

All-Round Personality Development of the Students (Maintaining a Balance between Curricular and Co-curricular Aspects) - Need of the Hour

Goal

At micro level, a cultured and literate woman can be instrumental in educating the entire family and at macro level, she adds to the social and economic development of the nation. Realising this, A.S. College for Women, Khanna aims at twin goals of enrichment of Curriculum thereby providing skill-based job-oriented courses in this globalised era to make the girl students economically independent and also at providing value-based education to make them socially responsible citizens.

Context

The college offers a wide range of courses and flexibility to its students regarding the choice of subjects and courses. Besides 2 compulsory subjects (English and Punjabi), the students have the option to select three elective subjects out of 18 subjects. It is compulsory for the students to study Environment Education as a non credit qualifying course at the under graduate level. Besides this, at present the college is running various Crash Courses like Crash Course in Spoken English, Computer Application, Internet and Basic Computers, English to Hindi Translation, Fine Arts, Fashion Designing and Personality Development. To provide quality education to the students, the institution has a fair mix of teachers and researchers with a lot of Ph.Ds, M.Phils and UGC/NET clear faculty members. Alongwith curricular activities, Co-curricular and cultural activities are meticulously planned to enhance the effectiveness of formal curriculum, impart additional skill, inculcate moral and civil values and sensitize the youth towards social and environmental issues. The institution imbibes civic responsibility in the young minds through extension programmes and value-based courses so that they come out as socially responsible and groomed up women.

The Practice

The Academic schedule is a well planned mix bag of co-curricular and cultural activities. Methods like assignments, audio-visual aids, question-answer sessions, class tests, snap tests, case studies, net surfing, workshops are incorporated in teaching-learning process, as these all are based on the mass participation of the students The students are required to attend 75% of lectures delivered as per the University rules. Facilities for remedial classes for educationally disadvantaged students as well as students belonging to weaker sections of the society, peer learning and tutorials groups are available.

The college makes special efforts to integrate technology with teaching learning process. Well equipped 3 Computer labs with 48 computers, 4 laptops and Internet facility with speed upto 572 Kpbs, LCD and Over Head Projectors (OHPs) are available to facilitate computer-aided teaching ad enrich the teaching learning experience. The college has rich learning resource in the form of fully furnished and well equipped library with more than 25,634 books, 13 newspapers, 60 magazines, 35 journals along with internet facility for searching 5000 free e-journals through INFLIBNET facility to facilitate research work by staff and students. The college also provides Book Bank facility. During the last 4 years, various faculty members and as many as 1781 students of the college got benefitted from the Library Reader's Club facility and Book Bank facility specially meant for helping the needy and meritorious students.

College playground includes 200 metre track, stadium, fully furnished Gymnasium Hall and equipments for Table Tennis, weight lifting, Badminton, wrestling, Boxing, Chess, Judo, Tai Kamando, Yoga, Kho-Kho, Kabaddi, Shot Put, Discuss Throw, Long Jump, Javelin Throw and High Jump.

The college has been showing excellent results in University Exams, since its very inception in 1973. The College had a whopping scorecard in the academic arena during the last four academic sessions i.e. 2010-2011, 2011-12, 2012-13 and 2013-14. In 2013-2014 Ms. Alisha of B.A I has brought laurels to the institution by bagging covetous First Position in the University Examination held by Panjab University, Chandigarh. Besides this, the institution has a glorious past record of bagging 04 First positions, 02 Second, 03 Third, 04 Fifth,02 Sixth, 02 Ninth and 01 Seventh, Eighth, Tenth and Fourteenth Positions respectively in Panjab University Examinations during the post accreditation period. Under the expert guidance of the Management and the Principal and co-ordinated efforts of the teachers, the excellent annual results of the last four sessions in University Examinations, kept aloft the glorious tradition as the general pass percentage of M.A. (Hindi) M.A. (Eco), M.A. (Soc), M.Sc. (Maths), B.Com III, B.C.A. III, B.Com. III Hons. B.C.A III Hons. and B.AIII Hons.was 100%; that of B.AII and B.A III was more than 95% and pass percentage of the college was much higher than University pass percentage. As many as 2210 students of the college made their alma-mater proud by getting first divisions and out of this, 104 students of the college scored 70% and 02 students got above 80% marks in university examination in session 2013-2014.

In last four years, in Inter- Zonal Youth and Heritage Festival, students of our college achieved 01 First position and 02 Third positions, while in Zonal Youth and Heritage Festival, students bagged 20 First positions (Individual and Group), 18 Second positions and 19 Third positions over the last 4 years. The institution is going to organize Youth Festival in session 2017-18. In State level/Inter college competitions, students bagged 06 First positions, 05 Second positions, 05 Third positions, 01 Sixth position and 1st Runner-up (Miss World Punjaban Cotest).

In Sports also, our sports girls brought laurels to the college. During last four years and till date, our college teams of Chess, Table Tennis, Judo, Badminton, Wrestling, Football, Boxing, Athletics and weight lifting participated in Inter College, Inter University, State and National level competitions and won Gold Medals: 04, Silver Medals: 06, Bronze Medals: 13, Second Position: 01, Third Positions: 03, Fourth Positions: 07, Fifth Positions: 05, Sixth Position: 01 and Seventh Position: 01. Five sports students were selected for Inter-University Camps and 01 student was selected for North Zone All India Inter- University Competition at Rudrapur (Nainital). In last four sessions, two NSS Units of the college organized 7 Day's Day Camps and Day-Night Camps. Community development activities, health awareness lectures and free eye and dental checkup camps, sanitation drives have been undertaken during these camps. During last four years, NCC cadets attended various Pre-RD Camps and Annual Training Camps at various places of Punjab and won Gold Medals: 07, Silver Medals: 16, Bronze Medals: 01, First Positions: 01, Second Positions: 03, Third Positions: 01 (7 medals during 2011-12), Two NCC cadets were awarded Sahara Scholarships of Rs. 12,000/- each. A number of NCC Cadets were selected for Firing Camps at NCC Academy, Ropar. Students are provided with the services of Grievance Redressal cell and Carrer Guidance and Counseling Cell. The college magazine 'Avastha' gives platform to the students to express their views and hence develop their thoughts and the writing skills.
